### **WEINZAPFEL REACTS TO GENERAL ASSEMBLY'S LACK OF ACTION ON AG HILL**

EVANSVILLE, Ind. – Jonathan Weinzapfel, Democratic candidate for Attorney General, issued the following statement reacting to the conclusion of the Indiana General Assembly's 2020 session in which no action was taken to remove embattled incumbent Attorney General Curtis Hill.

“In times of crisis, we need leaders who are single-handedly focused on protecting Indiana families. Attorney General Curtis Hill has disgraced himself and the office, and his legal problems are distracting him from the important work of keeping our families safe. Unfortunately, the Republicans in the General Assembly are more focused on protecting Curtis Hill than Hoosier families. Their failure to pass legislation last night prohibiting him from serving if he is suspended from office shows that they are putting politics above the law and partisanship before people. Hoosiers want to restore honor, integrity and purpose to the Attorney General’s office, and I’m confident they’ll join me in making sure that happens this November.”

Jonathan Weinzapfel was elected mayor of Evansville in 2003 and re-elected in 2007. After his two terms as mayor, Weinzapfel served as chancellor of the Ivy Tech Evansville campus from 2014-2019. He also served in the Indiana General Assembly as a state representative from 1999-2003. He currently works as a partner at the law firm of Jones Wallace in Evansville. Jonathan and his wife Patricia reside in Evansville and have three children.
