WEINZAPFEL STATEMENT ON AG HILL'S SUSPENSION

Evansville, IND. – Jonathan Weinzapfel, Democratic candidate for Attorney General issued the following statement on the Indiana Supreme Court Disciplinary Commission's decision to suspend Curtis Hill's law license for 30 days following allegations he groped women at a March 2018 legislative party.

"Curtis Hill's conduct towards the women involved in this complaint is as undeniable as it is inexcusable. He has embarrassed himself and the office which he holds. It is now up to the voters to hold him accountable and I will work every day through November to make sure that happens."

With the 30 day suspension, Hill will be eligible to seek renomination at the Republican Party's state convention which begins on June 19, 2020.

Jonathan Weinzapfel was elected mayor of Evansville in 2003 and re-elected in 2007. After his two terms as mayor, Weinzapfel served as chancellor of the Ivy Tech Evansville campus from 2014-2019. He also served in the Indiana General Assembly as a state representative from 1999-2003. He currently works as a partner at the law firm of Jones Wallace in Evansville. Jonathan and his wife Patricia reside in Evansville and have three children.
