WEINZAPFEL STATEMENT ON SUPREME COURT'S ACA DELAY

Evansville, IND – Jonathan Weinzapfel, a Democratic candidate for Indiana Attorney General, released the following statement today reacting to the Supreme Court's decision to delay ruling on the Affordable Care Act.

"This is a truly disappointing day. By punting on this decision, the Supreme Court is leaving the health care of millions of Americans and hundreds of thousands of Hoosiers in limbo.

What's worse is that this uncertainty was created by our own Attorney General. Curtis Hill used our tax dollars to join a lawsuit that seeks to decimate HIP 2.0 and eliminate protections for those with pre-existing conditions.

It's irresponsible, immoral and more about his personal political agenda than what's right for Indiana. I urge Attorney General Hill to exit this partisan lawsuit immediately"

Jonathan Weinzapfel was elected mayor of Evansville in 2003 and re-elected in 2007. After his two terms as mayor, Weinzapfel served as chancellor of the Ivy Tech Evansville campus from 2014-2019. He also served in the Indiana General Assembly as a state representative from 1999-2003. He currently works as a partner at the law firm of Jones Wallace in Evansville.
